Admission through NEST

Admission Rules

i. Eligibility

- Students seeking admission to UM-DAE CEBS under General/OBC/EWS category should have secured at least 60% marks in class XII or an equivalent examination. For SC/ST/ **Divyangjan** categories, the eligibility criterion is 55% marks. For Central/State Boards using a 10-point scale, these would correspond to CGPA of 6.0 and 5.5 respectively. Where only letter grades are available, a certificate from the concerned Board specifying equivalent percentage of marks is required to be submitted. In absence of such a certificate, the decision of the admissions committee of the concerned institution will be final.
- Student seeking admission to UM-DAE CEBS for the integrated M.Sc. Programme **2022-2027** should be from regular science stream only and preferably should have any combination of at least three subjects among Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics in class XI and XII.
- Students must have passed class XII examination or equivalent from any recognized Board in India in the **years 2020, 2021 or 2022.**
- The student should have been born on or after **August 1, 2002.** The age limit is relaxed by 5 years for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/Divyangjan categories.
- Students applying under the J&K quota should have the J&K Domicile certificate and must have passed their class XII examination from J&K State Board or CBSE affiliated school located in J&K.
- It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that the above criteria have been met and UM- DAE CEBS will not be held responsible for later disqualification of the student not satisfying any of these requirements.

ii. Documents required:

- a. Migration Certificate
- b. School Leaving / College Leaving Certificate
- c. NEST 2022 score card.
- d. Proof of Citizenship - OCI card (**applicable only if born outside India**)
- e. Anti-ragging affidavit, **on Rs 100/- non-judicial stamp paper.** Please note that it must be notarized. There are 2 anti-ragging affidavits a) one by the student, and b) one by the parent. **These two separate affidavits must be on a Rs 100/- stamp paper** each.

- f. Scanned copy of this affidavit **with signature of the student and parent on all the pages.**
- g. Caste / category certificate (OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS)
- h. If category certificates are not in either English or Hindi, then a translated version in English or Hindi must also be provided with proper authentication.
- i. Disability Certificate from Govt/Municipal Hospital showing at least 40% disability, if applicable.
- j. (At present only CLEAR scanned copies of the documents listed above are to be sent to admissions@cbs.ac.in. The originals plus two photocopies of the above documents, including signed copies of the undertaking, and the anti-ragging affidavits are to be submitted to the Academic Office at CEBS when you report to CEBS. Please do **NOT** send any documents by post.)

iii. Cancellation Policy

- Any student seeking cancellation of admission must do so by writing a signed letter addressed to the Dean, Academic Affairs, UM-DAE CEBS, Prefabs, Annabhau Sathe Bhavan, University of Mumbai, Vidyanagari, Mumbai - 400098, or through e-mail addressed to admissions@cbs.ac.in. The letter/email must mention the NEST roll number and must be accompanied by evidence of payment of fees.
 - If a student cancels his / her admission **on or before 8th August 2022**, he / she will be eligible for refund of the entire amount paid minus the administrative fee of Rs. 500/-.
 - If a student cancels his / her admission after **8th August** but on or **before 16th August 2022**, he / she will be eligible for refund of the entire amount paid minus the administrative fee of Rs. 1000/-.
 - If cancelled **after 16th August 2022**, he/she will be eligible for refund only the caution money and other deposits collected, if any.
- NOTE: All refunds will be processed by the First Week of January 2023.
Correspondence regarding refund will not be entertained before **till then**.

iv. Reservation and Number of seats

UM-DAE CEBS adopts the Government of India reservation policy for admission. The distribution of seats is as given in the table.

- In the event of the seats reserved for the OBC-NCL category remaining vacant after exhausting the corresponding merit list, they would be offered to the General Category students.
- Seats not getting filled from SC / ST pool will remain vacant.
- CEBS will close admission on 31st August 2022 and no fresh students will be admitted after this date.

Admission through KVPY

Only 12 seats available (6-General, 3-OBC, 2-SC, 1-ST)

Eligibility

1. Qualified through KVPY (SA) and have passed their 12th standard or equivalent examination from any recognized board in India in 2022 with at least 60% marks in aggregate (or equivalent grade) in the 12th standard board examination (for SC and ST candidates, the requirement is 55% marks).
2. The student should have been born on or after 1st August 2002. There is a 5-year relaxation in age for SC/ST and Divyangjan students.

Only students who satisfy the above two conditions are eligible to apply. Selection will be based on rank obtained in KVPY examination. In the event of more than one student having same rank, the marks obtained in 12th standard will be the deciding factor. OBC-NCL candidates should produce a NCL certificate issued on or after 1st June 2021 from the competent authority. The class should have been mentioned in the central list of OBCs (http://www.ncbc.nic.in/User_Panel/CentralListStateView.aspx). OBC-NCL Certificates issued on earlier dates are NOT valid.

Documents required at the time of admission and the cancellation policy are the same as applicable to students' taking admission through NEST. For details see the website cbs.ac.in

Admission through Science Olympiad Medalists (Supernumerary)

Only two seats (for details see the website cbs.ac.in)

General Rules are the same as for the students' taking admission under NEST or KVPY route.

General Rules

General rules are applicable to all students irrespective of their mode of admission (NEST/ KVPY/ Science Olympiad). Please note that this is a residential Five-year integrated M. Sc. Programme. For students admitted to the UM-DAE CEBS, stay in the Centre's hostel is mandatory. **There is no exit option after three years.** Upon successful completion of the five-year integrated course, a B.Sc. degree will also be awarded along with the M.Sc. degree.

1. As per the guidelines of Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) for DISHA Scholarship students are eligible for a monthly scholarship of Rs. 5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only) in the first year. A student may get Mentorship grant of Rs. 20,000/- per year.
2. The DISHA scholarships are available only to those students who are not eligible for DST INSPIRE or KVPY scholarships.
3. In addition to above a student is eligible to get the annual book grant of Rs. 6000/- from CEBS.
4. Continuation of the scholarship is determined by rules decided by DAE/DST at that point of time, **according to which**, at present, **it is required** that the scholar shall (i) pass in all subjects, and (ii) score at least 7.0 CGPA on a 10-point scale in **a given academic year** failing which the scholarship for the next academic year will not be awarded.
5. However, scholarship will be restored (only prospectively) in the next academic year, provided the scholar's academic performance is within the aforesaid eligibility norm as mentioned above in (4).

Fees

- i. For the fee structure for the first semester for all category students [please click this link](#) for details. In addition, Annual premium for medical insurance of tentatively Rs.1600/- will have to be paid by all the students. The exact amount will be communicated to all students.

Students also must pay Mess fee per semester in the beginning of each semester.
- ii. Students should ensure that all dues are settled on time. Financial penalty may be imposed otherwise.
- iii. In case of non-payment of any dues, the Centre can withhold issuance of documents such as grade reports, degree certificate, leaving certificate etc.
- iv. If the payment of fees or other dues is delayed beyond the stipulated date, the Centre holds the right to take disciplinary action including barring the student from appearing for the examination.

Selection of the major stream

- i. At the beginning of the second year, every student will opt for a stream of specialization. The stream will be allotted based on the academic performance (CGPA of the first year) and the preference of students. **The decision of the Centre in this regard will be final and binding.**
- ii. The maximum number of students that can be admitted to a specific School (Biological / Chemical / Mathematical / Physical Sciences) in the 3rd semester depends on the number of students getting promoted to the 3rd semester. The details can be found in the table below.

Example: Actual number of students getting admission in III semester (for example in the II semester 40 students are there but only 38 are taking admission then for seat allocation only 38 will be considered and therefore in a school only 11 seats can be filled not 12)

- iii. Students who did not have Mathematics as a subject at +2 level, may take courses M100 and M200 instead of M101 and M201 in their first year. Those who had Mathematics at +2 level, must take M101 and M201 which are prerequisites for taking Mathematics / Physics streams in the second year. For the students who did not have Mathematics at +2 level but want to take streams other than Biology and Chemistry, the prerequisites may be waived if they prove competency in the course content of M101 and M201 by appearing for a qualifying examination. Remedial courses will be offered to students who have not opted for Biology in their 11th and 12th standard courses.

Attendance Policy

- i. Attendance in lectures, tutorials, and laboratories is compulsory. If a student fails to have attendance below the stipulated limit as enumerated in the Undergraduate Manual, in any course, then a penalty will be imposed as per the guidelines in force. - ii. All students should have an attendance of 85% or more, except in cases of medical and / or personal emergencies (see below for details).
- iii. Minimum 85% attendance in all the **courses** is required to be eligible for appearing in the end semester examination.

Academic Standards

- i. The course work for the first two semesters is common to all students and is compulsory.
- ii. At the beginning of the second academic year, if a student has a CGPA less than 4.0 and/or has accumulated two or more F grades, then the student's enrollment in the Programme and continuation at CEBS may be terminated.

- iii. At the beginning of the third academic year, if a student has a CGPA less than 4.0 and/or has accumulated two or more F grades, then the student's enrollment in the Programme and continuation at UM-DAE CEBS may be terminated.
- iv. At the beginning of the fourth academic year, if a student has a CGPA less than 4.0 and/or has accumulated two or more F grades, then the student's enrollment in the Programme and continuation at CEBS may be terminated. The degree of B. Sc. may be awarded to such candidate(s) after completion of all the necessary credit requirements. Dean, Academic Affairs (AA), will inform all such students and their parents about this decision.
- v. If a student fails in any course, only one re-examination shall be permitted. If he/she fails in the re-examination, then he/she must repeat the course.
- vi. Notice for the possible termination of candidature shall be issued by the Dean, AA. Due communication in this regard shall be sent to the candidate as well as his/her parents.

Medical and Personal Emergencies

- i. The cases of medical and /or personal emergencies can be dealt with on case-to-case basis, by the Dean, AA.
- ii. The minimum attendance requirement as spelt out in Attendance Policy above, may be waived in the case of medical and/or personal emergencies by the Dean, AA on a case-to-case basis.
- iii. Students with medical emergencies is required get an appropriate certificate, duly endorsed by the medical advisor of CEBS to resume classes.
- iv. The student acquiring two or more F grades on account of medical and/or personal emergencies may apply to the Dean, AA for taking a break for a certain period. Upon the case getting duly authenticated by a competent authority and in addition to this, in the case of medical emergencies, upon receipt of a report from an authorized medical officer, the Dean, AA may permit the applicant to take a break for a certain period, duration of which will be decided by the competent authorities of CEBS. The student will be permitted to return to the Centre by producing a fitness certificate from the same medical officer who examined him/her earlier or any other competent authorized medical officer (in case of medical emergencies only). The student would be required to clear the F grades thereafter as soon as possible.

Code of Conduct

The candidature of a student in the academic Programme / hostel may be terminated if he/she is found involved in misconduct of any kind, which includes being engaged in ragging, sexual harassment, possession/ consumption of alcoholic drinks, contrabands, misbehavior with the colleagues, faculty members, the staff, etc.

The Centre reserves the right to amend the rules from time to time without any prior notice and the students will have to abide by them.
